

Anti-Doping Policy

1. Pentathlon Canada has adopted the 2015 Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) V2 (updated September 2017) as its primary domestic anti-doping policy. Administered on behalf of Pentathlon Canada by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES), V2 of the 2015 CADP is fully compliant with the 2015 World Anti-Doping Code (including 2017 amendments), International Standards and Guidelines as they may exist from time to time. 2. In addition, Pentathlon Canada, as a member federation of the Union Internationale de Pentathlon Moderne (UIPM) shall also be fully compliant with the UIPM anti-doping rules. The UIPM anti-doping rules may apply to certain members of Pentathlon Canada in certain situations. The UIPM anti-doping rules are fully compliant with the 2015 World Anti-Doping Code (including 2017 amendments), International Standards and Guidelines as they may exist from time to time. 3. In the event of a conflict between other anti-doping policies established by Pentathlon Canada and the current CADP and/or the UIPM anti-doping rules, the rules of the current CADP or the UIPM shall prevail, as applicable.
